'People with a learning disability die on average 15-20 years sooner than people without a learning disability¹, and often from causes that are commonly preventable. In response to The Confidential Inquiry into Premature Deaths of People with a Learning Disability (CIPOLD 2013), this has led to an obligation for NHS Trusts to report on their learning from deaths and deliver on the implementation of this work to improve the quality of care and reduce avoidable premature mortality.
